They are also stressing on the importance of helping others especially by way of food and medical supplies.

Therefore Religions for Peace Pakistan/ACRP Pakistan Chapter has started a grocery distribution drive to the poor.

We are collecting money in the form of charity and ZAKAT in collaboration with Rotary Club of Karachi Bay and distributing it to the poor. We are also giving money to other charitable organizations which are working for this cause. Also to animal organizations as many stray animals are also going hungry because of the lock down and some have been abandoned. As we believe that every drop counts.

In addition we have received the generous offer from CCRP who is donating a 10000 masks so that we can distribute them.

In such times we in Religions for Peace Family stand together with the rest of the world in helping people with renewed faith that WE TOGETHER WITH THE HELP OF THE ALMIGHTY WILL OVERCOME THIS PANDEMIC.
