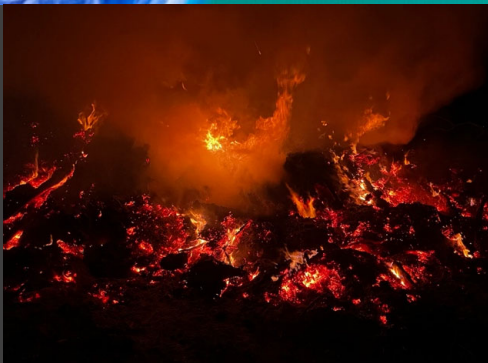



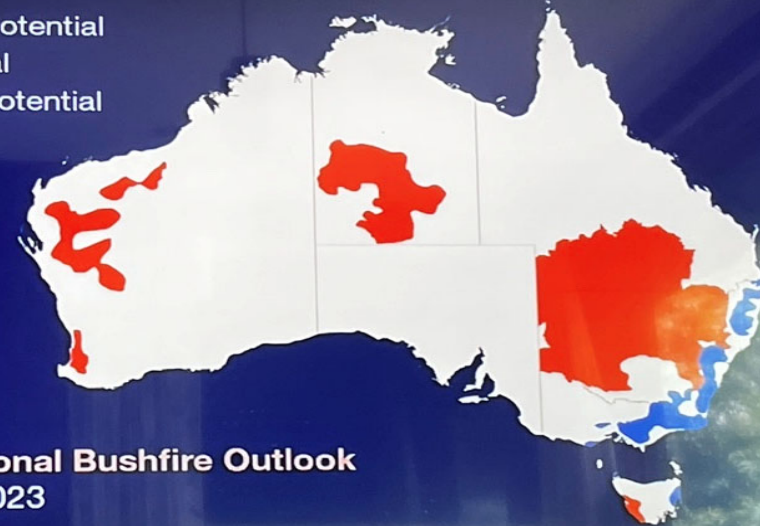

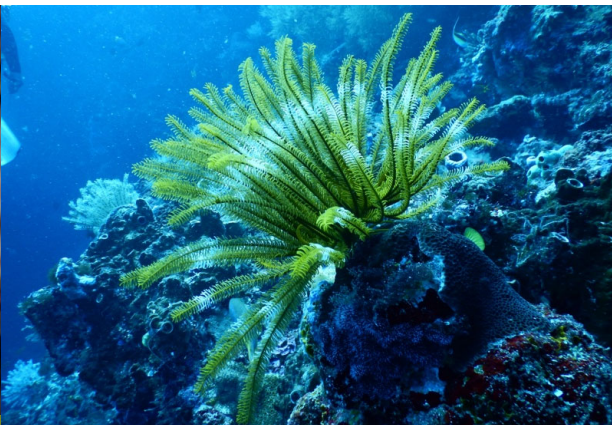

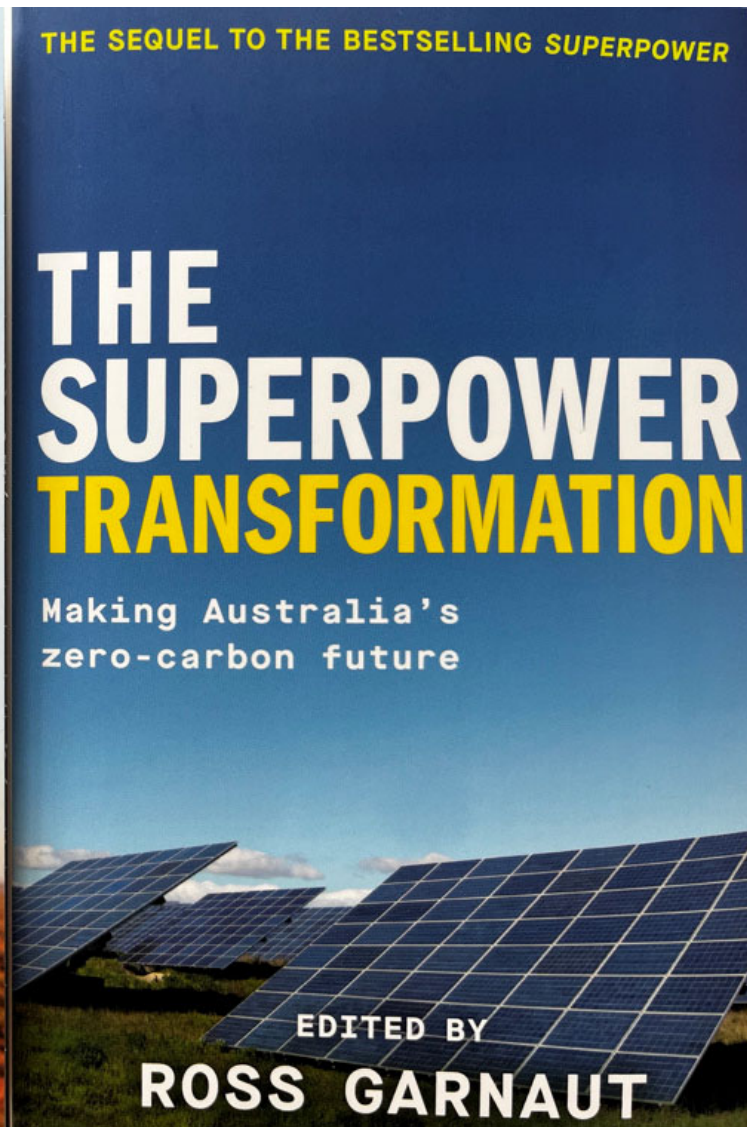
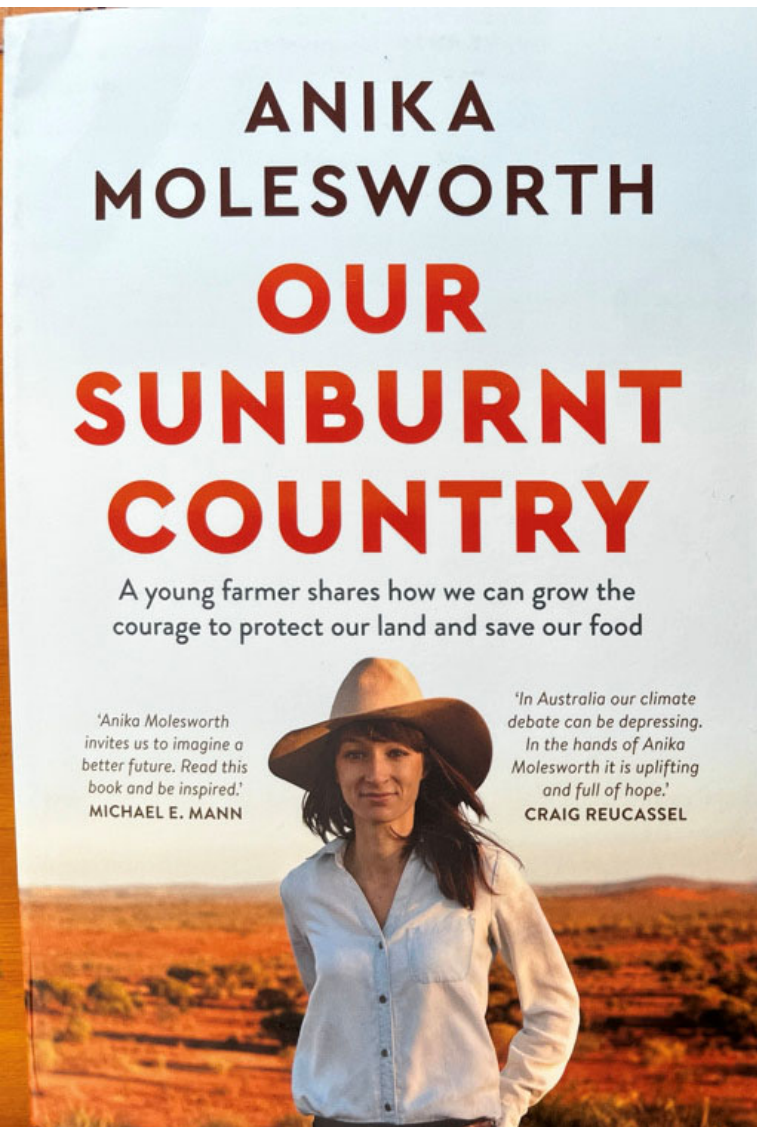
We humbly and respectfully request that Australia:
