Overall;

Many CP AoR members have started collecting RNA and some CP assessments in their targeted areas. The data and findings are still under process of compiling and the final reports have not published yet. The response plans will be initiated based on the findings.

Some of the agencies who went to the community are being stopped by the SAC due to lack of TAs/approval letters from Governments.

TA requirements is one of the biggest issues for some flood affected areas in Magway regions; SAC have issued the statements/letters to all Village Administrators not to provide any data, or collaborations with any agencies without prior TA/approval from SAC.

CP Concerns;

- Landmines and IEDs have been found within the communities after the landslides and floods.
- Few family separation cases have started to be reported in Sagaing and CSO is providing reunification services
- Children traumatized by the cyclone, and are need of MHPSS interventions (CFS)

Child Protection Responses;

- MRE/EORE awareness raising sessions are currently on process of provision
- CP monitoring is under process
- Providing MHPSS key messages through Volunteers
- Immediate response: IEC distribution and sharing process-
- CP key messages via pamphlet (EORE- post cyclone awareness, IFRC cyclone preparedness comm, Guide to action for Cyclone, Diarrhoea, hygiene, et
- Provided mental health support to chidden and adult

Challenges/Needs/Gaps;

- CP Kits; Clothes are needed for the children.
- CFS kits are also needed for the MHPSS support.
- Access concerns due to destructions of Road and Flood.
- Affected community members are mainly expressing the needs for WASH, Food, Shelter and Clothes/NFIs. But CP interventions are not much interested by the communities.
