





A USD 10,000 was allocated by the ACRP for the implementation of the Strategic Plan

ACRP through APIYN has the ability to create resource materials for the training & capacity development of youth across Asia and the Pacific.





APIYN GRANT & YOUTH JUMPSTART FUND

We heard from a survivor's perspective of the severe suffering of the people. We also heard from various speakers and religious leaders who helped us learn about the importance of abolishing nuclear weapons

We had the honor and privilege of visiting the Hiroshima Peace Memorial Park and Museum which commemorates the painful events of 6 August 1945 when an atomic bomb exploded in Hiroshima that led to the death of approximately 140,000 lives. This visit allowed



The APIYN 2026 Agenda is a three- year plan for APIYN's Global Flagship Projects leading to the 50th Anniversary of ACRP in 2026.











2023 - 2024: Youth Action on Disarmament
