I. Background of the Problem

Sitaution Report of Sindh:

Due to the ongoing floods in Pakistan, 13.5% of Pakistan's population has been impacted in terms of loss of property. 90% of Sindh's 60% crops have been destroyed as reported by the official statistics of National Disaster Management Authority. The flood disaster claimed 616 lives and and injured 11,563 people. And, almost one million people have lost their livestock and crops.

Heavy monsoon rains triggering the floods across Pakistan are undoubtedly the result of climate change as the planet heats up and weather extremes are exacerbated, but this is no fault of Pakistan, which has emitted only 0.4% of global carbon emissions since 1959.1,076,582 Households & 6,028,859 population affected in 11 calamity affected Districts of Sindh. ¹

So far, thousands of people have been rendered homeless, and hundreds of tent communities have emerged across the country. According to government reports, the flood damage in Pakistan is far-reaching, <u>leaving close to three quarters of a million people without access to safe and adequate housing.</u> Large swathes of agricultural lands have been flooded, destroying crops and threatening the country's food supply.

The destruction and death in Pakistan has shown how these floods risk entrenching existing inequalities and putting millions at risk of homelessness, hunger, ill-health and even premature death.

Poverty and gender affect impact of floods

The floods had a particularly devastating impact on people living in poverty as many of them live in inadequate and poor-quality housing along riverbanks, low-lying areas and areas that are difficult to reach due to lack of adequate infrastructure. Little has been done so far to protect these communities from the impacts of climate change.

Women are particularly adversely affected by the floods. According to the <u>United Nations</u> <u>Population Fund</u>, there are almost 650,000 pregnant women in the flood-affected areas, with almost 73,000 women expected to deliver in the next month. More than 1,000 health facilities are either partially or fully damaged in Sindh province, whereas 198 health facilities are damaged in affected districts in Baluchistan.

There is also a heightened possibility of women and girls being at risk of gender-based violence, according to <u>UNICEF</u>, owing to the breakdown of order and social protection mechanisms during a crisis. Menstrual hygiene must also be given its due consideration when

developing relief programs, with the UNFPA estimating the victims of the floods to include 8.2 million women of reproductive age. 2

III. Needs/Challenges of the Project:

Religions for Peace to collaborate with Rotary Club ,Pakistan District 3271 Clubs especially in Sindh and in Balochistan and also with Jamia Islamia Clifton, Alkidmat Trust, Six OneonONe Foundation, Hindu Coucil, Pakistan Churches Association, MIniority and Religious Affairs Ministry and Climate Change and Environment Ministry and Parliamentarians and Planning and Development Commission,Womens Ministry And other organizations to work towards flood relief operations. The devastating August 2022 floods—affecting thousands of people mainly in Dadu, Sukkur, Khairpur, Hyderabad, Jamshoro @ Kotri, Nausheroferoze, Badin, Thatta, Sajawal, Jacobabad, Kashmore, Larkana, Umerkot, Sakrand and Qambar Shahdat Kot districts of Sindh—caused severe damage to livelihood, infrastructure, and other assets. These districts of Sindh are the most affected ones, therefore, we will operate our flood relief activities on urgent basis. The flood water also disrupted economic activities, inflicting heavy losses to crops and slowing expansion in industries and services. The floods slowed progress in poverty reduction, with the poor and the vulnerable suffering most in terms of losses to crops, livestock, property, and housing; and reduced income opportunities.

IV. Implementing Partners of the Flood Relief Project:

Religions for Peace Pakistan along with its collaborating partners and religious leaders from all communities work for effective and efficient relief activities and to provide the people with special emphasis on elderly, poor, women, men and children with the basic necessities needed for surviving in the face of such natural calamity. The project will be led by the official grantee, Religions for Peace, Pakistan. Religions for Peace Pakistan has people belonging to all religious communities and they have contacts all over Pakistan. The flood affectees will be given emergency relief without any discrimination of the religion; all religions will be treated equally such as Muslim, Hindu, Christian, Men and Women Pastors, Sikh and Parsi Religious leaders. The Need of the hour is to involve all of them and different civil society organizations and government departments for disbursement of the relief operation goods. If possible the relief camps will be set up near religious places of worship.

V. Scope of Work/Activities



VI. Management Plan and Institutional Capacity

Religions for Peace is an international coalition of representatives from the world's religions dedicated to promoting peace founded in 1970. Religions for Peace is the main project grantee of this Emergency Flood Relief Drive 2022.

For the project operation, Ms. Huma Ikramullah will serve as an official. She serves as a Secretary General at Religions for Peace Pakistan along with Muhammad Hanif Khan Vice President.

Both the organizations will maintain close liasions for smooth operation of the flood relief drive across 20 districts of Sindh through their s. In total, the social outreach of this project will be 120 communities in Sindh and over 20000 people will gain benefit as the project will be carried out in collaboration with other partner organizations where the visibility of Religions for Peace Pakistan will be apparent. In future, we will also participate in more coalitions to improve the socio-economic development of Sindh.

VII. Sustainability & Rehabilitation of the Program

This project would have long term impact where flood affectees will rely on this project; Emergency Flood Relief Drive on developing flood-affectedcommunities. The Joint collaborations with 32 Camps of Rotary Pakistan , Jamia Islamia Clifton, Hindu Council , Pakistan Churches Alliance and Government Minsitries will spread project messages to other communities about the impacts of climate change , poverty impacts , safety and medical information. Moreover, it will create a sustainable program where community head will be able to deliver benefits of flood relief, establishing a direct connection with the government for the problem solving of flood-affectedfamilies in the future. Though social media campaign, we will created awareness of flood-affectedcommunities among 2000 social media users. These social media users will also be inspired to assist flood-affected communities. The 13000-20000 participants in 13 districts of Sindh will receive flood relief and medical relief through camps. From each camp, we will assign a community leader who will raise voice and reach



concerned department for other flood-affected individuals as the leader will already have information about the prevention tools of flood relief.

VIII. Monitoring, evaluation & Risk management:

The Emergency Flood Relief Drive 2022 will have a Monitoring & Evaluation (M&E) team assigned for conducting and evaluating the flood relief activities throughout the project. The team will look after the activities and prepare monitoring report of each activity that will cover gaps/challenges occurred during the flood relief drive and give recommendations. To manage the flood management activities, we will maintain close networking with provincial institutes of each districts that are directly and indirectly involved depending on the support and services required during the Emergency Flood Relief Drive in 14 districts. For instance, in Sindh the institutes are categorized into risk-managing and crisis-managing institute so we will conduct risk management accordingly.

IX. Anticipated results (Outputs, Outcomes, Impact):

The objective of the Project is to do proactive relief work to improve the lives of about 200 households in Sindh, seriously affected by the 2022 floods. It will contribute to by providing tents / shelter to the families, mosquito nets, safe drinking water, medicines and basic dry food items. Along with flood relief work, we will provide medical education to the direct 20000 benificiaries and indirect more than 20,000 beneficiareis in the flood-affected areas of 14 respective distrcts..

The interventions have been identified in consultation with the Religious leaders and NGOs, and other civil society organizations; and involve community participation. To reduce costs especially transportation costs partnership with other organizations already working is also highlighted.

SUSTAINABILITY:

This project would have long term impact where communities will rely on Knowledge about flood relief service providers. The social awareness will spread knowledge about their fundamental rights and other related information. Moreover, it will create a sustainable program where community head will be able to deliver benefits, Though social media campaign people will be able to connect with the financial supporting program.

Activities:

Medical Camp in Sakrand – 10000 people treated with medicines and doctors team
of top hospitals of Karachi and awareness also given about diseases.

A medical camp for nearly 10000 people affected by floods was set up in Sakrand Sindh an area hit badly by the floods. Medicines related to fever, flu, infections and skin diseseas

Religions for Peace

were sent for the camp. A team of skilled doctors were arranged from top hospitals of Karachi went to provide free medical treatment and awareness on how to tackle the diseases created by the floods. In this camp women , children, old and poor were treated without any distinction of caste, creed , color and religion. In this region there are many Hindus who were also given all the treatment free of cost including check up , information and medicines. Letter and Pictures attached .

2. 5000 Mosquito Nets and food distribution to 4000 families in 20 districts in collaboration with Rotary District 3271

Over 5000 mosquito nets, 500 tents and dry food was distributed to flood affected people in 15 districts of Sindh by Religions for Peace Pakistan in collaboration with Rotary Pakistan District 3271.
