## Community Outreach and Humanitarian Projects

### Clean and Accessible Drinking Water for All Religious Communities

1. **Initiatives:** In an effort to ensure equitable access to safe drinking water, RFP Pakistan initiated the installation of solar-powered water filtration plants and hand pumps in underserved areas, particularly those inhabited by religious minorities. These facilities now serve thousands of residents across rural Sindh, Balochistan, and South Punjab. Over 80 handpumps installed in collaboration .
2. **Interfaith Collaboration:** Local religious leaders—imams, pastors, pundits, and granthis—were engaged in site selection and community sensitization to promote ownership and sustainability.
3. **Impact:** Beyond addressing waterborne diseases and child malnutrition, this initiative also strengthened interfaith solidarity by demonstrating shared concern for human dignity and public health.

#### **Solar-Powered Water Filtration Plant and 15 handpumps funded by RFP**

- **Location:** Sindh.
  - **Capacity:** Provides clean water to 10,000+ residents daily.
  - **Sustainability:** Funded by RFP Pakistan
4. **Ramadan and Easter Relief Programs**
    - **Led by:** Zeeshan, Chairperson, Civil Society Organizations Network.
    - **Impact:** Distributed food/clothes to 15,00+ families; installed 80 handpumps in drought-hit regions.
    - **Wheelchair Initiative:** Provided mobility aids to 200+ disabled children.
  5. **Climate Change Awareness Campaigns**
    - **Led by:** Sadia Tariq, Chairperson, Media and Youth.
    - **Activities:** Seminars at universities; partnered with CSO on a youth-led *Green Influencers* program.

- **Goal:** Mobilize 200+ pro bono lawyers to defend climate refugees and persecuted minorities.
